- From schedule announcements to work experience opportunities and a range of guest speakers it is up to YOU make the most of this time and to begin to prepare yourself for 5th year!




### Leaving Certificate Subject Choice

### Traditional Leaving Certificate

Two-year academic programme that allows students to take <u>seven</u> subjects at Higher, Ordinary or Foundation Level





### Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme

- This is an **additional** subject (i.e. this would be an 8<sup>th</sup> subject for students)
- Any student can choose it regardless of other subject choice combination
- Points are awarded differently to other LC subjects (Pass = 50% Distinction =80%)
- While LCVP can be used for points purposes, it cannot be used for matriculation at NUI colleges
- It has a **strong vocational dimension** with two link modules (work preparation and enterprise)




### **LCVP**

- Exam Structure
  - 60% Portfolio of Coursework
  - 40% Examination
- Students who would suit LCVP would:
  - Have excellent attendance and engagement
  - Work well to deadlines
  - Organised and can work independently

### What subjects to choose?

- Choose subjects you enjoy
- Choose subjects you have an aptitude for
- Research what this subject consists of for the leaving cert.
- Look at **exam results** to date
- Ask your subject teacher or Guidance Counsellor for information
- Choose subjects you need for your chosen career
- Keep options open for the future
- Talk to parents/guardians or older family members
- Have a look at senior textbooks and exam papers online.
- Read the subject information booklet carefully
- Research using online resources & websites






#### Don't make rash decisions

Subject choice should not depend on what teacher may be teaching a certain subject at Leaving Certificate

Neither should it depend on rumours as to what is an 'easy' subject

Don't pick a subject because a friend is doing it


### Entry to College: 3 Factors



- Minimum Entry Requirements for each University/College
- Specific Course Entry Requirements (may also involve interviews, portfolios etc)
  - Points in leaving cert

University of Limerick	2H5 + 4O6/H7	O6/H7 in Maths, English. & Irish or another Lang.
Dublin City University	2H5 + 4O6/H7	O6/H7 in Maths, English or Irish
Technological University Dublin	2H5 + 4O6/H7 (H.D.) 5O6/H7 (O.D. or H.C.)	O6/H7 in Maths, English or Irish

### Specific Subject Requirements

- Maths, English and \*Irish Core subjects
- A third language is required by NUI colleges
- Higher level Maths \*most Engineering courses
- Higher level Irish Primary teaching

### Science Subject Requirement

- One science subject required for most Nursing, Medical/ Health Sciences/ paramedical courses
- One Science subject –Engineering courses
- Chemistry –required for Dentistry, Pharmacy, Veterinary Science, Human Nutrition and Dietetics
- 2 Science subjects required for Medicine in most Universities
- Biology Advisable for Nursing studies, Beauty therapy, Nutrition

#### Gaisce



- Gaisce or 'great achievement' is a self-development programme
- 1. Community Involvement
- 2. Personal Skill
- 3. Physical recreation
- 4. Adventure journey





- All students will partake in aiming to achieve their Bronze Gaisce Medal from the President of Ireland.
- The school facilitates the Gaisce's Community Placement for all students who meet specific criteria, with support provided once they qualify to have an enjoyable Community Placement during TY.
- Eligible students can sign out at 1:10 pm on Wednesdays. The requirements will be outlined in May by a letter to all TY students and again in September by Mr. Farrell. A €15 fee, paid directly to Gaisce in September is required (not the school).



## Early University Entrance Programme DCU

• TY students may participate in Early University Entrance at DCU. Students get the opportunity to study modules from a degree programme of their choice on one day each week, over the course of one or two semesters.
